

Calvin's Corner:

"...and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us."

> Romans 5:5 NASB

Hope! Over the last two months I have come to a greater understanding of the hope we have in Jesus Christ. First Corinthians 13:13 reminds us, "And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love." As Christians we talk about the love of Christ, knowing: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). We understand about faith: "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith — and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God — not by works, so that no one can boast" (Eph 2:8-9). Hope, however, is often misunderstood because we equate it to a wish. The hope that Christ brings us is not a wish but an assurance of the promise that God gave the world long ago.


The Bible calls it a "living hope." "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy He has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade — kept in heaven for you, who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time" (1 Peter 1:3-6).

This is the hope I heard from a Ukrainian teacher and mother who, though she had lost everything she owned and dreamed, her faith in Christ allowed her to move her entire family to a new country. There, her family shares the hope of Christ with others. This is also the hope that I heard from families struggling to support and protect their children in El Salvador. With a little help, in the form of a scholarship for their children to attend a safe Christian school, they heard and received the hope of salvation in Christ.

We live in a world that is looking for hope. But the only true, lasting hope is found in the gift of salvation through Jesus, our Lord. It is this hope that we celebrate at Christmas. People were hopelessly separated from God. This is the reason Jesus was born. The angel of the Lord assured Joseph of this fact, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel' - which means, "God with us'" (Matt 1:20-23).

As you celebrate the birth of our Savior this year do so by sharing Christ with others so they, too, will know the hope you have. I pray you will have a blessed Christmas filled with the Hope of Christ.




