### Calvin's Corner:

#### God's Will and Your Life - Colossians 1:9-11

What is God's will for your life? We often approach such a question like an Agatha Christie mystery. If we find all the clues and put them together in the right way, maybe we can solve the mystery before the end of the book. While God's will may have elements of mystery, we make it much more difficult than God intends. When we say that we are seeking God's will, we most often are trying to find answers to a specific item in our life -- "Should I buy this car, should I take this job," and so on. What we are really doing is trying to get God to make our decisions for us. While God is interested in every decision we make, His specific will becomes much clearer if we will follow Him in the areas that He has revealed.

In writing to the Colossian church, Paul prays they will grow in the knowledge of God's will. "And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God" (Col. 1:9-11 ESV).

We are to "walk worthy." Another way to say "walk worthy" is "be obedient." It is God's will that we walk worthy by being obedient in every area of our life. Our tendency is to qualify our obedience by saying, "Lord I am willing to do anything you ask, <u>but</u> I can't teach, I need Sundays off, I have a lot of work to do, wait until I finish school, look at my age," and so on. Walking worthy with Christ demands that our obedience has no qualifiers. This is God's will for your life. "I beseech you, therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God" (Rom. 12:1-2).

It is God's will that we produce fruit (Col 1:10 "... bearing fruit in every good work" and "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5, NKJ).

What does it mean to produce fruit? Are we to grow apples or peaches? No! The character of Christ Jesus is to be reproduced in our lives. As that takes place, we are to be witnesses, sharing the truths of Christ to people around us. It is not we who work for God: it is God who works in us and through us to produce the fruit of his grace. "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law (Gal. 5:22-24). Christian service is the result of Christian devotion. The work that we do is the outflow of the life we live. It is by abiding in Christ that we can produce fruit. Note, we will not just occasionally serve God; we will be "fruitful in every good work."

It is God's will that we grow in knowledge. In verse 9, Paul prays that they will be filled with the knowledge of God's will. Here his prayer is that they grow in the knowledge of God Himself. Knowing about God and knowing God are two completely different things. To know about God is simply to understand the facts. To know God is to build a relationship with Him. The place we must start is to spend time with Him in prayer and in study of His word. How much time have you spent alone with the Lord this week? Take every opportunity you can to learn the word of God. Be involved in Bible study. It is God's will.

It is God's will that we be strong. Col. 1:11 says, "May you be strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy." Often we get God's plan backward. We want God to give us strength, then we will serve Him. Yet God wants us to serve Him and He will strengthen us as along the way. The construction of the sentence is a conditional phrase: "If we walk worthy, bearing fruit, and growing in Him, His strength will be with us all the way."

If you want to find God's will for your life, do what you know and God will reveal the rest. What is God's will? To walk with Him, bearing fruit, and growing closer to Him.

Three of these guys are new Christians so we began to meet for Bible study. (I took them out for breakfast once and they continued asking questions for over 2 hours!) 




