#### Calvin's Corner:

Recently, national news outlets have reported that for the last 20 years a number of Southern Baptist pastors and leaders have been accused of sexual crimes against minors. Such news should sicken us. After all, we would rather not talk about these issues. However, for the sake of the Gospel and for the sake of the witness of the church, we must respond.

1. We must admit that there is a problem. David learned that hiding sin is futile. "O God, You know my foolishness; And my sins are not hidden from You" (Ps 69:5, NKJV). While we know we can hide nothing from God, it also is not wise or ethical to attempt to hide it from the world. Paul in 1 Cor. 5 rebukes the church for not dealing with sexual sin within the congregation. Ignoring sin the public knows about weakens our witness. We do not need to publicly scorn a sinner, but we must be seen as practicing what we preach.

2. We must present consistent biblical doctrinal teaching on sexual issues. Sex is not evil or sinful when honored as created by God in a loving, caring relationship between a husband and wife. Satan has taken our natural desires and twisted them so that sex is only about the pleasure and not the relationship. Such a twist leads to a slippery slope of sin and perversion. It may start by using sexual attraction as a seemingly innocent marketing tool. It can progress to pornography and the lie that it is a victimless obsession. The desire of pleasure often leads to fornication and adultery that can lead to unwanted pregnancies, to abandoned, forgotten children, or to abortion. This slippery slope also produces mistrust between couples, broken marriages, and confused, conflicted children. Even worse this perversion can lead to rape, human trafficking, and child abuse. I could continue with examples but I think you get the idea. Some would argue that the church is not the place to teach about such matters because it should be taught at home. I agree, but it is not taught in most homes or even in the best homes. The church should support parents with good teaching. The alternative is that such teaching is left to the school, which often is not Christian based, and/or to the street where pleasure is the rule.


3. We must not forget the victims of these sexual crimes. All too often the victims of sexual abuse are left to feel guilty and dirty for most of their lives. The church must reach out to assure them: "It is not your fault." We need to comfort, accept and, when necessary, help them seek good Christian counseling.

4. We must provide a safe environment while still ministering to sinners like ourselves. Think of this challenge like a hospital. Hospitals exist to care for the sick. With so many sick people who may be contagious, hospitals do everything in their power to create a clean environment so diseases are not passed to others. Likewise, the church must do everything it can to create a safe place for all while ministering to sinners. Some things you can do are:

- Do background checks on all staff and everyone who works with children. This is so easy to do nowadays. Many insurance plans will help you. We at the association office can help you as well. These checks are a must, but don't think they are enough because they will only show those who have already been convicted.
- Develop and <u>follow</u> good policies. Policies that hold people accountable are a must. Policies like no one, including the pastor, being alone behind closed doors with a member of the opposite sex or with youth and children. Again, many insurance companies will help you write good policies, and the association office can help you with this area as well.

I realize that this is a heavy article but one I believe important for every church to consider. Please do not fall for the line that it can never happen in our church. Sexual abuse happens in churches of every size, those in the city and those in the country; no one is exempt. For the sake of our children, let us not be guilty of ignoring the problem. The witness of the church and the cause of Christ demand it.
