

Calvin's Corner:

Pisgah Baptist Church 200th Anniversary--

Every church should occasionally review its history. In doing so, you will discover the reasons why the church was started and the dedication of the original members. You will also likely discover some inspiring stories that will encourage your church today and possibly some past mistakes that you should determine not to repeat. This month Pisgah Baptist Church will celebrate their 200th anniversary. A review of their history doesn't show many mistakes but many dedicated people and inspiring stories.

Pisgah Baptist Church was organized in June of 1819, making it one of the oldest churches in Missouri and one of the very few from that era still alive today. Just think, the church started 16 years after the Louisiana Purchase, 13 years after Lewis and Clark completed their exploration, and two years before Missouri became a state. The history of Mid-Missouri shows only a few people made the trip up the Missouri River into the area in the early years. Those who came, such as members of Daniel Boone's family, mainly came to profit from salt deposits found at Boone's Lick, but a few settled into the area. They stayed near the river and built small forts for protection. Around 1814 more protection of the area allowed settlers to begin to pour in. They brought with them the can-do attitude it took to tame a wild land, a dedication to their family and a commitment to God. Many of these new settlers were Baptists from Kentucky. As they came, they planted churches across Mid-Missouri. One of those early settlers was John B. Longan. He moved into the area sometime around 1816. A Baptist pastor who had already planted churches in Kentucky, he continued to do so in Missouri. He was a charter member of Pisgah Baptist Church and served as its first pastor until 1847. Even while serving as Pisgah's pastor, he helped plant many other churches. He helped plant Mt. Pleasant Baptist near Clarksburg, Sardis Baptist that later became First Baptist of Elston, Mt. Gilead Baptist that became First Baptist of California and Cole Spring Baptist near Russellville.

Pisgah and Pastor Longan were instrumental in beginning Concord Baptist Association in 1823, and in 1934 the Baptist Central Convention of Missouri, which became the Missouri Baptist Convention. When opposition to mission giving rose in the early days of Concord Baptist Association, churches like Pisgah and Pastor Longan led the way to overcome this challenge by standing up for mission causes around the state and the world. Another important fact about Pisgah was that they stood against slavery in our nation. They determined that no one who owned or who participated in the trade of "other human beings" could be a member of the church.

Pisgah Baptist membership grew to over 300. Time and circumstances changed as the railroads bypassed them and other communities grew, causing the Pisgah community to dwindle. Today, though the community is gone, the church is alive thanks to that same can-do attitude, love of family and commitment to God that helped settle the area. Join me to celebrate with Pisgah Baptist on Sunday, June 23 at 2:00 p.m. Thank you, Pisgah, for your dedication and commitment to our Lord.

Baptist Collegiate Ministry

Last fall I had the joy of leading one of our football players to Christ-a player who grew up here in Jefferson City. He came to my house with another player to talk because they were upset over the death of a fellow student with whom they grew up. I was able to help my new Christian friend lead his friend to Christ! Recently I met with these 2 men and one of their brothers. We watched about 2 hours of Christian videos. They learned about the deity and glory of Christ and the necessity of attending and becoming involved in a local church. I have become good friends with the family of the 2 brothers and have seen the parents make a rededication to the Lord and return to attending church. I am always so wonderfully pleased and amazed at how God allows the gospel to be spread among us.

Of the 3,000 food items that were collected by the Royal Oak Christian Academy for the new food bank at Lincoln University, only about 25% remains after distribution days on April 28 and May 3. A very exciting new ministry is up and running! We need your congregation to partner with this ministry.

Most of our track team is comprised of students from Jamaica. Because of that many of them will not be able to return home following their final national competition on May 23rd. I talked recently to the coach and we will be providing an end-of-year celebration gathering for them afterwards. This is a good opportunity for our churches to provide food and have a great time of fellowship with these delightful folks. Let me know how you would like to participate alongside us.

Next month I will provide information about our plans for the fall and how you can become involved in this great work on campus. Many thanks for your continued prayers!
