

Everyone was involved but a few churches deserve a special thank you. Thanks to Memorial Baptist for hosting the Missouri Baptist Disaster Relief efforts. Thank you to Russellville Baptist Church for becoming the care center for displaced families in Jefferson City and Eldon. Another example of selfless acts of ministry came from Freshwater Church. They could not meet the Sunday after the tornado because of debris blocking access to their building. So, a large group from the church went to Eldon to help residents with clean up. Another example is Joshua House that gathered baby supplies and clothing, which they are giving to those with that need.

The tornado is not the only challenge we face. Flooding is also affecting many. Lupus Baptist Church has been flooded but volunteers from Main Street Baptist and other friends from the area helped them move their pews, instruments and other furniture in order to keep them dry. They will need help to clean up and sanitize once the waters recede, and I'm sure you will be there to help. Many more examples of your acts of service could be mentioned, so forgive me if I did not include something your church has done.

Good job to all but let us think of lessons learned from the past weeks:

I believe God smiles when he sees His people helping one another.

We work better and accomplish more when we work together.

The community takes notice of the unselfish acts of love of the church.

We should work together at all times, not just in times of crises.




