Pastor's Chat

Let us be intentional!

I have four kids: 9, 6, 3 and 7 months. For the record those are not their names. As you already figured out, those are their ages . So as you can imagine, my calendar is packed with all their schedules, extracurricular activities, birthday parties, church events, etc. Not to mention that I pastor a church and have my own coaching and consulting business. My wife Kristin and I have pretty busy lives, and in order for us to be able to parent well, fulfill the responsibilities of our ministries, jobs and still find some "free" time for leisure and or rest, we have to be intentional about everything we do. Because of the nature of what I do, many times I find myself in the position of giving, giving, giving so, if there is one area in which I need to be intentional, it is personal growth. The dictionary defines growth as "the process of increasing..." This increasing could be physically, spiritually, emotionally, mentally, etc. "Growth is development. It is progressive acquisition of various skills (abilities) such as head support, speaking, learning, expressing the feelings and relating with other people."

The author of Hebrews says the following about growth: "Therefore let us move beyond the elementary teachings about Christ and be taken forward to maturity, not laying again the foundation of repentance from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God," Hebrews 6:1. The apostle Peter gives us an amazing picture of what spiritual growth looks like: "For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." 2 Peter 1:5-8.

So, regardless of the role you play in any area of your life, let me ask you the following questions: 1) What are you currently doing to grow/develop yourself? 2) What are you doing to grow/develop others? 3) What needs to happen for you to start working on/implementing the two questions above? John C. Maxwell, a pastor, teacher, author, and speaker who has written many books, primarily focusing on leadership, once said, "Growth is the only guarantee that tomorrow is going to be better." In his book, '15 Invaluable Laws of Growth', the first law he talks about is the law of Intentionality which states "growth doesn't just happen."

So, as we start this new year, my encouragement to you all is, "Be Intentional" specifically about your personal growth! Here are some practical steps you can follow in order to achieve growth in 2020:

- 1. Make a commitment to intentionally grow. [Be intentional.]
- 2. **Make the commitment public**. [A commitment that is not public is worthless.]
- 3. Identify the areas you want to personally grow in. [At least 3 but no more than 5.]
- 4. **Invest one hour a day on the areas listed above.** [Including Sunday]
 - Preparation. Practice. Reflection.
- 5. Invest one hour a week on reflection and writing on what you have been working on.
 - One word. Bullet points. One sentence.
- 6. **Share your growth with someone.** [Find someone to share your growth.]
- If they react happy continue doing it. If not, find someone else. So, do not spend time with people that are not thrilled with your progress.
- 7. Repeat this process as needed. [Be intentional.]

Let's us be intentional!

- Our pantry is always in need of snacks and small food items.


Classes at Lincoln University will resume after Christmas break on January 21.
