After a long Christmas break, classes at Lincoln resumed on January 21st. On February 2nd, my wife and I hosted a Super Bowl party where we watched an evangelism video at halftime. Among the students were several members of the women's basketball team—one is from Australia and another from Spain.

Previously, we have reached out to the sports teams and I was invited to lead in pre-game prayer/devotionals for women's basketball. Building on these friendships, I have enjoyed some theological/ biblical discussions with these players in the student cafeteria. We have also connected with the women's softball team. I enjoyed seeing them win both games of a double header last Friday! Since I cannot attend away games, I have been leading a devotional/prayer with these teams when they depart. Pastor Steve Hogard (Hickory Hill Baptist Church) and I met with the softball coach this week. Steve has agreed to be their chaplain!

On March 6th, we will host the track team for our annual goat roast. We have traditionally seen students come to the Lord at this event when we have shared the gospel through word or video.

The football team is officially into the spring season. As Chaplain, I have met with Coach Hoskins and he has agreed to have a Coach's Bible Study each week. We will also distribute surveys to all players which has allowed me to get closer, learn of their needs, etc.

Finally, we have started a noon bible study on Wednesdays. Several football players have attended, and I have discovered some committed Christians who want to get involved in reaching out to the campus. Thank you for your continued prayers!
