

In late February, I attended the final home basketball game for the women and led a pre-game prayer and devotional. Thereafter, I led departing prayers for away competitions for the track, basketball, and softball teams.

That God will bring good out of this crisis for this university community that we love, as hearts are reminded of what is ultimately important, and that many will come to Christ. We have sewn a lot of gospel see...pray that as God continues to water, we will hear of many coming to the Lord!

April Executive Council Meeting – originally scheduled for April 19th, has been <u>cancelled</u>.

Associational & State Bible Drill – the current, statewide plan is that churches will not be joining other churches for Associational or State Drills. Churches are to hold drills for their own students at a time when it is deemed safe to do so. This plan is subject to change, but we will keep you updated of those changes as we learn of them.

3MT Spaghetti Dinner & Auction – will no longer be held on April 18th. This event may be rescheduled for June, pending other 3MT Board decisions.

July Executive Council Meeting – scheduled for July 12th at 2 pm, <u>will take place as scheduled</u> at Enon Baptist Church.

Concord Builders – is still tentatively scheduled for July 6th-11th. This decision will be reevaluated as the Concord Builders' Leadership monitors how the COVID-19 situation continues to unfold.

3MT – is still tentatively scheduled for July 11^{th} - 18^{th} . This decision will be re-evaluated on April 25^{th} , and more information will be forthcoming.

Children's Camp – is still tentatively scheduled for July 20th-24th. This decision will be reevaluated as the Children's Camp team monitors how the COVID-19 situation continues to unfold.

The leadership teams of these events have many difficult decisions ahead of them as we head into the summer months. Please continue to keep them in your prayers as they make the difficult decision whether to keep, postpone, modify, or even cancel these important ministry events.
