Our process was to narrow the group down multiple times through discernment and prayer until there were three candidates to interview through Zoom video conferences. We considered many excellent and qualified candidates before voting to recommend our final candidate. We will let the Executive Council make plans to release the candidate's name and the future plans for voting.

Dear Concord Baptist Association,

BAPTIST COLLEGIATE MINISTRY UPDATE:

Being a people-oriented person, it has been quite difficult for me not to be near the Lincoln University campus and community during this time of COVID-19. But we have reached out in different ways, such as providing food, phone calls and text messages. We have distributed encouraging devotional thoughts and scripture through texting and also sent several video clips with a strong evangelical theme. But our ministry is always about the individual person, so let me share with you this beautiful story.

Coach Ailene Smith began her 17th season this year as the Assistant Men's and Women's Track & Field Coach. During that time, she has helped guide Lincoln to 13 Division II National Championships. She has coached over 600 All-Americans! She has been my go-to person whenever the Baptist Collegiate Ministry has provided a goat roast, a barbecue or an ice cream social, et cetera...for the coaches and team. She also has attended our Bible studies and helped me distribute Bibles and gospel tracts.

When her mother came visiting from Jamaica a few years ago, she also came to our Bible study, As we finished, she drew me aside and said, "Be sure that my daughter comes to know the Lord", and I promised that I would do all I could. From that point on, Ailene has been on my prayer list. I have shared Christian literature with her and have spoken to her occasionally. Again, she has been my go-to person coordinating help for sequestered internationals who remain on campus.

As we spoke on the phone yesterday, she informed me that her mother had passed away. After expressing my sympathies, I relayed to her what her mother had said to me years ago, to which she replied, "Oh, I accepted Jesus and was baptized last December!" (at a church in Jefferson City). Imagine my joy in learning that!!! So, we rejoiced over the national championships that are in the future for Coach Smith. But I know that she, along with all of us believers, is guaranteed a glorious finish line in heaven and that she and I will see her mother again, standing there with arms open wide, cheering us home...all because of Jesus! (she joyfully and readily gave me permission to share this great story with all of you)

3MT – The 3MT Board made the difficult decision to cancel the 3MT mission week for 2020. Based on the current and future COVID-19 situation in Mid-Missouri, the board felt that it was wise to protect the individuals most vulnerable to the virus, especially those that this project serves. Please begin praying for the 2021 3MT Project.

Children's Camp – is still tentatively scheduled for July 20th-24th at Camp Rising Sun. This decision will be re-evaluated as the Children's Camp team monitors how the COVID-19 situation continues to unfold. The final decision will be made July 1st. A note from the team and a parent survey will be emailed to all churches to be distributed to families, so please be on the lookout for that and complete it <u>as soon as possible</u>. The responses received (including the number of responses) will be a big factor in the Children's Camp Team's decision, so getting as large a number of parent responses as possible is vital.

The leadership teams of these events have many difficult decisions ahead of them as we head into the summer months. Please continue to keep them in your prayers as they make the difficult decision whether to keep, postpone, modify, or even cancel these important ministry events.

YOUR INPUT IS NEEDED

Due to the COVID-19 situation, we are still evaluating the impact on summer programs that we typically send our summer missionaries to assist with.

As the restrictions on gatherings and activities are beginning to be lifted, you are likely beginning to discuss what your churches will be doing in terms of your summer ministries and activities. We understand that this summer is going to be a lot different than any we have had before, so we are trying to evaluate the potential need for summer missionaries so that we might hire appropriately.

We understand that your plans may still be very tentative, but we would greatly appreciate it if you could share with us your current plans (and tentative dates/times, if possible) of any summer activities for which you would likely be requesting a summer missionary. This could be for your VBS, Backyard Bible Club, Sports Crusaders, or another special project or ministry. You may even be choosing to spread your activity out over the course of a month instead of every day for a week. Ministry might look a little different this year, but we would love to hear about your vision, so that we can gauge your needs and make a plan to help meet those needs.
