A WORD FROM OUR DOM

Dear CBA Churches,

December is a special time and gives us a great opportunity to reflect on the birth of Jesus. Jesus the Messiah; Jesus our Lord! Remembering Christmas unleashes wonderful childhood memories for many of us. As we reminisce, how many of us lost a night or two of sleep just tossing and turning worried about trying to memorize our lines for the great Church Christmas Pageant? Sometimes I became so consumed with the performance that I forgot about the message. But as I have matured a bit from my childish ways, I have realized that I cannot lose sight of this incredible message:

¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. "THE EARLS FRONT PORCH"



Hello, I am Paula Earls, wife of your Director of Missions, Alan Earls. I will be sharing a little about us over the next several months. So welcome to our porch.

We are so eager to get to meet with as many of you as possible and to hear your needs and share in your accomplishments. But until we make it to your church, I wanted to help you get to know us.

Today, I share a little about my upbringing and how we met. I was born and raised in Kentucky right at the western tip. In Kentucky sitting on the front porch was where you really got to know people with lot of storytelling, sharing a glass of sweet tea and even a little courting.

My Mom and Dad were very involved in a Southern Missionary Baptist Church where I was raised and accepted Jesus. My Dad was a coal miner and Mom stayed home. Getting to go to church was wonderful! It was through Mission Friends, GA's

and Acteens I learned about places far away and serving the Lord.

Every year at Christmas time we were given baby food jars to save our spare change for "Missions" specifically Lottie Moon. I remember learning verses to earn coins and cleaning up and doing anything to raise money for my jar.

It was so exciting to return the jar full of coins. I knew I was helping missionaries obtain the items they needed to stay on the field to share Jesus. So at a very young age I learned how we support missionaries.

As I grew up, I knew I wasn't to stay in the coal mining town. I wanted to go to college and do something with my life for the Lord. I was fortunate to attend Western Kentucky University (WKU) in Bowling Green. It was a four-hour drive from my parent's home. It seemed very far away; however it was my opportunity to see what God had in store for me.

While attending WKU, I was called to the mission field for 10 weeks one summer. It was that summer God allowed me to meet Alan. We had a great time serving the Lord together until I had to return to Kentucky. We planned to meet up again and again until a couple years later we ended up getting married. Wow! How awesome God is to have

brought us together on the mission field.

Years later when we began our youth pastorate at Mt. Olive, Russellville, MO. I wanted to help our congregation understand missions more and to raise funds for the missionaries. So I had an idea of a Lottie Moon Express for Christmas cards. Alan and I worked with the youth so I had plenty of delivery help. I also had a church member who always was willing to make my dreams a reality. Jim Plaster built me a Lottie Moon express. It had an engine for the donations, a car for the cards and even a coal car for this Kentucky gal.

The church responded so faithfully by donating their stamp money to the Lottie Moon Christmas offering. We delivered all their cards to the church members. It was so wonderful to have everyone involved in supporting our missionaries. I am happy to say it has been running for almost 25 years.

The CBA office is excited to introduce you to a new initiative from Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary (MBTS). It is called For the Church Institute or FTC Institute. MBTS through FTC Institute is offering free online courses for who may be seeking theological education. These courses are offered free of charge to anyone within your church that is interested in theological education but is not necessarily after a degree or paying a lot of money. You are encouraged to click on the link below and see what you think. It is possible for you to offer these courses within your church. The 10-week lesson plans are all online and there is no additional requirement to purchase any additional resources. For the Church Institute is part of Midwestern's core value to serve the church. You do not receive seminary credit, however, upon completion of the course you do receive a certificate and are eligible for Continuing Education Credit, if any of your licensures would require CEU's. Some of you may have your seminary degree and want to have a refresher; some of you may not have had an opportunity to attend Seminary; some of you are mentoring those called to the ministry and could use these courses in organized mentorship; some of you are seeking to work on leadership development for your church lay leaders and will find this opportunity to greatly help them enhance their Biblical understanding. It is great for Sunday School teachers, small group leaders, pastoral staff, and anyone that desires and needs the training.
