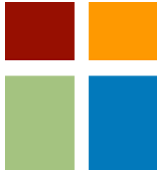

# A WORD FROM OUR DOM



Dear CBA Churches,

It is always great to see God at work. I don't know if you are like me but sometimes when I see God working I don't always realize what He is exactly doing or if I understand. But it is always a joy to see Him working and I have realized that it is always an invitation to join Him in the work. God was getting ready to reveal something special... *"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me..."* Matthew 25:35-36a

On Monday August 9, 2021 I received a telephone call from Salem, North Carolina. It was someone I had never met nor have spoken to. The pleasant lady shared that she and her husband had traveled to Liberia several times for short term mission trips and she was in desperate need. She proceeded to share that a very special young man whom she and her husband met on the mission field was flying into Columbia airport from Liberia on Thursday August 12 to register for Lincoln University on the next day. She stated that he had no one to pick him up from the airport nor did he have a place to stay on Thursday night. She was searching for a Christian connection and was given the CBA contact information.

As I wrote down the information I prayed to the Lord as to what we should do. I immediately felt a peace and told her I would pick him up and I would make arrangements to have a safe place to stay on Thursday and get him to Lincoln the next day.

I met Joseph at 9:00 pm on Thursday. We had a great visit. He is a devoted Christian man that served the Lord in his home country. He left behind a beautiful Christian wife of three months to travel to Lincoln University to start the graduate program in Agriculture. Talking about sacrifice, Joseph understood.

The next morning Joseph and I started a journey to get him registered for school. Our first stop didn't pan out. As we traveled to Young Hall we stopped by the CBA office. Clint Mahan the BCM minister who had every bit of two days experience on the job, was in the office. We invited him to walk with us, so off we went. What we expected to last an hour or two, finally ended around 6:00pm. I bailed on them after 10:00 am thinking all they had to do was get Joseph's housing. But after two trips to Cole County Health Department, an email to get his shot records and walking through about every building on campus, Clint made sure Joseph had a dorm and settled for the night and all by 6:00 pm. God gave Joseph two new Christian friends and Clint received a full year's orientation in a day. God had uniquely qualified Clint with 18 years of international mission's experience. Clint was able to capitalize on this experience and use it to help Joseph and to bring honor and glory to God. Clint is probably the only person in Jefferson City that had the experience to help walk a brand-new student from another country, who knew no one. Isn't God's ways, incredible? I am looking forward to seeing what God is going to continue to do through the months ahead, but if Thursday and Friday is any indication, it will be exciting to see opportunities all around us. Has God brought a Joseph into your life? Is God revealing opportunities to you? Pray, seek and do...

## SEPTEMBER IS MMO MONTH!

Imagine providing rape survivors with clothes, hygiene kits and teddy bears. Or creating a "farm system" for bivocational ministers and spouses to serve as licensed practical nurses (LPNs). Or connecting local churches with partnering congregations in the Americas and Europe.

You can engage in these ministries – and many more – as you give to the Rheubin L. South Missouri Missions Offering. Our annual state missions offering supports 24 ministries. These include Christian foster care, rescue from human trafficking, ministries to senior adults, summer missions, disaster relief, church revitalization and other projects that help transform lives and communities with the gospel.

The theme of this year's offering is taken from 2 Corinthians 8:5. Paul praises the churches of Macedonia for begging to be included in a collection for suffering saints in Jerusalem. Hello, I am Paula, wife of your Director of Missions, Alan Earls. I enjoy sharing a little about us, so welcome to our porch.

Growing up my family did two things each summer – camping and visiting my Aunt Pauline (mama's sister) and Uncle David in Tennessee. We camped Memorial Day weekend and didn't get to go to Tennessee until all the gardening and canning was done in late August.

My Mama's oldest sister Pauline is who I was named after, so she always was very special to me. She also had a daughter close to my age who was like a sister. One of my favorite memories of visiting my aunt's family in the mountains was drinking from their cold spring with a metal dipper. It was like drinking water straight out of the icebox on a hot summer's day. I can't remember anything tasting better!

One summer I remember my Daddy sharing Jesus with my Uncle David while drinking at the spring. He shared one of my favorite verses from Isaiah 55:1 *"Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you who have no money come and eat without money and without cost."* He was telling him about the free gift of Jesus and how we all needed to accept him as our Savior. 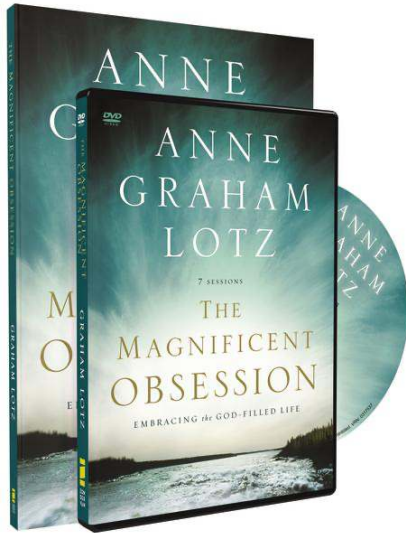
Until next time, be on the lookout for opportunities during these hot summer days to share a cool drink, a kind word and a whole lot of Jesus!

# THE MAGNIFICENT OBSESSION: EMBRACING THE GOD-FILLED LIFE BY ANNE GRAHAM LOTZ



In this book, Anne Graham Lotz takes a close look at the life of Abraham and his journey of faith. I have always enjoyed studying and reading about the people of the Bible and this book does not disappoint. Beginning in Genesis chapter 12 with God's call to Abraham to leave his home and go to a place God will reveal to him, Lotz follows Abraham as he packs up his household and leaves everything familiar behind him. As we move through this chapter-by-chapter examination of Abraham's life, Lotz includes challenges to us in our walk as well, "I do know that if you and I ever truly know God, it will not be an accident. It will be because we have pursued with focused intentionality. It will happen when like Abraham, we abandon every other goal, every other priority, and embrace the God-filled life until He becomes our magnificent obsession," (Lotz 2009, p. 22). As we learn more about Abraham, we also learn more about Lotz. She transparently includes her struggles in her personal walk. There is much to admire and emulate in Abraham's life, but there were also some monumental failures, Egypt, Abimelech, and Hagar to name a few. Lotz does a good job of showing us what Abraham had to 'let go of' as he learned to trust everything completely to God.

Lotz also looks at the people in Abraham's life. She gives us a very honest and frank look at Lot and his selfishness, Abraham's wife Sarah in her ups and downs alongside Abraham, Isaac and what his thoughts must have been as he journeyed with his father to Mt. Moriah, and the obedience and respect Isaac must have felt as he allowed his father to tie him to the altar.

There are far too many quotes from the book that stood out to me to include them all, but I will leave you with two that deal with the theme of the book. One is when Lotz points out that "...you are His [God's] magnificent obsession," (Lotz 2009, p. 209), and "The magnificent obsession should be contagious simply by the way others see me embrace it for myself," (Lotz 2009, p. 249).

There is a study guide and a DVD available if you wish to make this a small group study. The study guide is different from what you may be accustomed to as it is arranged not in a question format but allows the participants to engage in a personal verse by verse look at Scripture then meet together to watch the DVD and share insights.

I always enjoy reading Lotz's books and appreciate her insights and her transparency. This book is definitely worth your time, and I recommend it wholeheartedly.
