Dear CBA Churches,

The month of October is Pastor Appreciation month. Some of our churches really enjoy loving on their Pastor and their wife, while some churches just don't recognize the importance or significance of encouraging their Pastor. This article is not intended to make you feel guilty or to make you feel proud, I just want to take a moment to acknowledge these special men who are called by God to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

I am reminded of Romans 10:14& 15 which states, ¹⁴ How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? ¹⁵ And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" Romans 10:14-15. Friends your Pastor is the one preaching to "them". Your pastor is the anointed one to equip the people of God "for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up."

Today I would like to share with you a little about our Missouri Missions Offering and how it advances the kingdom work at home. So welcome to our porch.

The Rheubin L. South Missouri Missions Offering (MMO) is our state's annual missions offering, named after the late executive director who pioneered the annual giving emphasis that today supports projects in four areas of ministry:

Making disciples – sports evangelism; Vacation Bible School training and resource development; youth evangelism and missions; and the state fair ministry of the Missouri DOM Fellowship.

Collegiate ministries – collegiate summer missions mentoring initiative; international student ministry missions conference and regional gatherings; and a new technical school initiative. Remember Alan and I met when I was a summer missionary right here in Missouri!

Multiplying churches – next-step requests for church multipliers; partnership missions in Montana and Minnesota/Wisconsin; and strategic missionary development. I know many are encouraging Pastor's wives through this as well as praying about going on missions to one of these partner areas.

Developing leaders – disaster relief equipment and volunteer readiness; WMU; Missouri Baptist Resound Network; Baptist Builders and volunteer mobilization; and hunger relief. Many among us have served the DR and Baptist Builders. These are such important ministries that must continue.

In addition, 17 percent of MMO receipts go to the Missouri Baptist Children's Home, which provides spiritual guidance, counseling, and a safe haven from abuse and neglect at five state campuses.

One thing I really want to point out is 10 percent of MMO gifts go back to the associations of the giving churches, where the funds support regional mission projects. We know many can't give a lot for the extra offerings; but this one really helps to advance the kingdom work right here at home!

Book Review:

Praying Through the Names of God

by Tony Evans

In this book, Tony Evans explores the different names of God given in Scripture. We know from studying the Bible that different names are used for God in different situations. For example, in Genesis chapter 22, Abraham calls God Jehovah Jireh, the Lord will provide, when God provides a ram to use for the sacrifice rather than Isaac. Although, unless you are a student of Hebrew, the meaning of these names are lost. We also know that in Scripture a name carried a lot of meaning. A name was attached to a person's character, hence the occasional name changes in the Bible i.e. Abram to Abraham, Jacob to Israel. Therefore, in teaching us more about the different names of God, Tony Evans is teaching us more about God's character and how He interacts with His people.

Each name is presented in a prayer, and each prayer is arranged in the ACTS format: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication. Each prayer is focused entirely on that particular name of God with a related scripture verse where that name is used.

I personally found reading one or two prayers a day more meaningful than reading multiple prayers at one sitting. Using this book as a devotional and focusing on one name at a time enables us to devote our thoughts and our prayers to that particular aspect of God's character. "The Bible includes more than 85 names of God. Each one gives us a description of who God is and how he relates to his creation. We can see God's relevance to our particular situation by appealing to him based on the revelation of his names," (Evans 2014, p.11).

For those wanting more of a teaching focus rather than a prayer focus, Tony Evans also has a book entitled "The Power of God's Names" which is more of a bible study and, even though I have not read it...yet it would be more appropriate for a group study while this book is more of a personal study and devotional. Both books are definitely worth your time if you are wanting to know more about the names of God.
