Pastor Spotlight:

Pastor Brad Homan, Fortuna Baptist Church



Hey everyone! My name is Brad Homan and I currently serve as the senior pastor at Fortuna Baptist Church. It is hard for me to believe, but this church has now been my home for almost 20 years, as I started attending when I was just 17 years of age. I originally was drawn to the church because it was located in a booming and successful economic metropolis...okay, that is not really true...but rather because I was invited by a friend to come hear him preach one of his first sermons. (Many of you all probably know him, as his name is Andrew Kuttenkuler, who currently serves at Oakland Baptist Church.)

Now before I visited that day, there is a backstory that you need to be aware of. At that time, I had preached ONE sermon in the church that I grew up in about 6 months earlier, as I thought I had felt the call to ministry. However, when I finally received that opportunity to

preach, let's just say...it didn't go so well. In short, I had prepared and prepared and thought my sermon would last approximately 35 minutes...well... it instead ended up lasting around 9-10 minutes. Therefore, from that point forward, I began to question if I was really called by God because I clearly was NOT a public speaker.

Well, to get back to the main story. The day that I went to hear Andrew speak, it radically changed the course of my life. Now, to be honest, I couldn't tell you the passage of scripture that Andrew preached from that day, but I do remember what he said after the sermon. After Andrew got done preaching, the head deacon came up to the front of the church and addressed the crowd of about 30 or so and said, *"Andrew, you did a fantastic job! We need more young men like you who are bold and preach the gospel.* Andrew then pipes up and says, *"Well, my friend Brad has preached a sermon before."* The next thing I knew, I was on the schedule to preach to this congregation the very next week as they were without a pastor. Talk about a wave of emotions that ensued the following week: Feelings of doubt, fear, anxiety and yet still a reassurance of God's calling placed upon my life.

So, I say all of that to say this, even though I was pretty much convinced that I would never preach again, God reassured me that He had other plans. For the next several years, I became very plugged in at Fortuna Baptist. I had the opportunity to preach monthly, to be discipled by a retired pastor and to work with the youth group. Then in 2009, I officially became the pastor of Fortuna Baptist Church.

It is so funny in how God works, because if you were to tell me that morning of when I first entered into the FBC building about 20 years ago to hear a friend preach, that years later, I would become the full-time senior pastor, I would have snickered and thought you had last your mind. Even today, sometimes I wonder, "God, why did you call me to Fortuna? Why would you use me, an untrained hillbilly, one who is okay at many things, but excels at nothing, one who has never gone to seminary, to play a role in bringing our community closer to Christ?"

And the only answer that continues to come to me is, "Because you are who I desired to use."

It is humbling to note that my own abilities, intelligence, talents, nor good looks are what have contributed to revitalizing a small church.

I am reminded of what it says in 1 Cor 3:5-7 (NKJV):

"Who then is Paul, and who is Apollos, but ministers through whom you believed, as the Lord gave to each one? I planted, Apollos watered, <u>but God gave the increase.</u> So then neither he who plants is anything, nor he who waters, <u>but God who gives the increase</u>."

Our church is not perfect, not even close to it...but God is stirring the hearts of many in our community, and He is doing some incredible things through FBC. And may I say, what a privilege and honor it is to see God work!

Book Review:

Joy that Lasts: How to have an Overflowing Life by Gary Smalley with Al Janssen

Every person desires to have a meaningful, joy-filled life but often achieving a joy-filled life can be a struggle. In this book, Gary Smalley addresses reasons we sometimes find fulfillment unattainable using his own personal struggle as an example. "For the first time, I began to realize my major mistake: I was expecting to find fulfillment in people, places, possessions and position," (Smalley 1986, p. 23). Smalley is very open in sharing how he realized he was "expecting his relationships to keep my cup filled," (Smalley 1986, p.23). From there, he outlines the process he followed, addressing persistence, faithfulness, and dependence on God. Throughout the book, he reminds us that joy can only come from one source: God. Smalley tells us how to grab hold of fulfillment, addresses the main cause of unhappiness, and how to address the major destroyers of joy. Smalley also shares the advantages of trials in our life and what those trials are meant to produce.

Gary Smalley has written an excellent book on how to live a joy-filled life, but it is a book on prayer as well, "...looking back over the first nine chapters, I realize I've written a book about building a relationship with God through prayer." (Smalley 1986, p. 166). Throughout the book, he is very open about the importance prayer played in his journey and gives specifics on incorporating prayer into a life of joy.

If you are familiar with Gary Smalley's work, you will already know that he usually concentrates on family relationship issues. While this particular book is more personal, you will find that following the guidelines he gives us will have a positive effect on your personal relationships. This book has been around a while as it was published in 1986. However, you will find the advice and information he gives relevant for today's world. I did not check all major retailers, but it is still available from Amazon and christianbook.com
