YOU WERE MADE FOR THIS MOMENT BY MAX LUCADO



In this book, Max Lucado takes an in-depth look at the biblical book of Esther. Lucado wrote this book during the height of the COVID quarantine lockdown, a time that definitely could be categorized as a 'winter' for us all. However, his focus is not on winter; his focus is on what we do when we experience a time of winter. "The book that bears her name was written to be read in wintertime...It's as if God, in his kind

providence, heard all the prayers of all the souls who have ever been stuck in an arctic February... says, 'Follow me. I want you to see what I can do.'" (Lucado 2021, p.5).

Lucado moves systematically through the story of Esther and Mordecai as they come to realize God is calling them to stand out rather than blend in. In examining the struggles of Esther and Mordecai, Lucado issues the same challenge to Christians today. We too, are called to stand out in our world to be "... billboards of God's message," (Lucado 2021, p. 25).

I confess that I enjoy reading Max Lucado, and have never read one of his books I did not find well worth my time. He writes for the average believer and doesn't try to impress with an expansive vocabulary. He writes in a way even a newer believer can follow.

This book captivated me from the first page and even led me to change our church's summer book study to this book before I had even finished it. There are reflection questions at the end of each chapter, but there is also a 5-week study guide and DVD available for purchase. I recommend reading any Max Lucado book, but I found this one especially relevant to the world we live in. This is a worthwhile read for every believer.

SHARING JESUS WITH OTHERS:

I really like Bill Faye's approach to sharing the gospel. He has written material called, "Share Jesus Without Fear". He uses questions to determine where God is working. He asks five questions.

- Do you have any kind of spiritual beliefs?
- To you, who is Jesus?
- Do you believe there is a heaven and hell?
- If you died right now, where would you go? If heaven, why?
- If what you believed were not true, would you want to know it?

By asking questions you are not arguing with the person you are sharing with. You are simply asking a question and letting them answer. Their answers will reveal what they believe. If they answer yes to the last question they have given you permission to share the gospel with them. There is an app you can download to your phone with this plan. I believe they charge 99 cents to download it. I have used it. It is not the only way to share the gospel but it is one way.

The only way you can fail at sharing the gospel is not to share the gospel. May we all pray for boldness and get busy sharing with the lost, how a Savior came from glory to save a wretch like me!
