

A Word from our DOM

Dear CBA Churches,

As we begin the new month of November, we are often reminded to be thankful. Of course we should be thankful every day, but sometimes we need a reminder to be thankful in all things. In Colossians 2:6-7, the apostle Paul is reminding the Christians of Colossae to remain committed to the foundational truth of the Gospel of Jesus. God's word shares,

"Therefore, as you received Christ
Desus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted
and built up in him and established in
the faith just as you were taught,
abounding in thanksgiving."

If we are walking with Jesus; rooted in Jesus; built up in Jesus and faithful in Jesus, then we can live in abounding thanksgiving.

Just a personal question to consider in your heart: Does people see you living an abounding life in thanksgiving to the Lord? Sometimes I think it can be as simple as what the Apostle shared in Colossians 2. Go back to our foundations of our faith. The joy of Jesus in our life brings thanksgiving to our heart. 

Twelve Extraordinary
Women: How God Shaped
Women of the Gible and
What He Wants to Do with
You by John Mac Arthur



Twelve Extraordinary Women was written as a follow-up to MacArthur's previous book, "Twelve Ordinary Men," (recently reviewed in the September newsletter). Here, MacArthur has chosen twelve women with a direct relationship to the redemption story. Beginning with Eve, there are chapters on five women from the Old Testament and seven from the New Testament with Martha and Mary combined into one chapter.

As he did in his previous book on the twelve disciples, MacArthur uses scripture to explore

each woman, their faith, and their perseverance. He provides background information where possible and appropriate. For example, the chapter on Mary Magdalene gives us an interesting look at demonpossession in New Testament times. Each woman highlighted shows qualities we should all strive to emulate including loyalty, grace, faithfulness, hospitality, and worship.

I did find a few chapters where in his desire to demonstrate the true nature of these women, namely as sinners in need of a relationship with God, I found that MacArthur ventured too far into negativity. This was particularly apparent in the chapters on Abraham's wife Sarah and Rahab from Jericho. The result was an overall impression of his apathy or even disdain for those women. Most of the chapter on Mary, the mother of Jesus is devoted to disproving the notion she should be worshipped. While true, I was hoping for a different approach.

My edition of this book includes study questions in the back. There is certainly enough presented here to spark interesting discussions for any small group, male, female, or coed. I would be interested to know if others reading this book have the same mixed reaction I did. If you or a study group you participate in decide to read this book, let me know what you thought. Comments may be directed to the Associational Office, and they will forward them on to me.

He had been to my home before but one Thursday evening in August of 1980 he cast out the gospel bait and I was hooked, gloriously saved! My life has never been the same since. I became a new creation in Christ. The old man was gone and I became a brand new creation.

Let me challenge you along with myself: "Do all the fishing you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, for as long as you can!"

If we will go fishing we will catch fish. We may not catch fish every time we go but one things certain if we go often we will catch
