

We also would like to have a small gift for those under 10 years old (think fishing lure, paper targets, etc...)



Help is Here: Finding
Fresh Strength and
Purpose in the Power of
the Holy Spirit
by Max Lucado



Many believers, at some point in their spiritual journey, come to a place where they realize they know very little about the Holy Spirit. Who is He? What does He do? What about spiritual gifts, am I supposed to have one? In *Help is Here,* Max Lucado has written a book for anyone desiring to know not only more about the Holy Spirit but more about how to yield ourselves to His power.

Lucado begins with a testimony of his early years as a pastor when he was ministering in his own strength and his journey to realizing he had a power source available to him he was totally ignoring.

Lucado tells us in chapter one, "your Bible makes more than a hundred references to the Holy Spirit. Jesus says more about the Spirit than he does about the church, marriage, finances, and the future," (Lucado, 2022, p.8).

Each chapter is devoted to one aspect of the Holy Spirit beginning with Teacher, Wind, and Intercessor, and concluding with Gift Giver and Breath. He does not delve into how to determine your spiritual gift; he addresses what a spiritual gift is and is not and why we are given gifts.

What Lucado teaches is based on scripture, not church doctrine, giving readers a clear picture of what the Bible says about the Holy Spirit rather than what a particular church teaches. I appreciate this distinction due to the strong feelings teaching on the Holy Spirit sometimes elicits.

I confess, I consider a Max Lucado book a definite purchase. I appreciate his down-to-earth approach written for the average believer in the pew which he presents on a solid base of scripture. This book contains study questions in the back, written by his daughter Andrea, as well as a separate study guide book (typically contains different questions and fewer sessions) and a video which can be purchased as a DVD or streamed online. Help is Here is a perfect choice for any individual or small group with a desire to learn what the Bible teaches us about this often overlooked member of the Trinity.

A History of Concord Explist Association

Concord Baptist Association was organized in 1823 by twenty-five delegates from eight churches: Concord, Big Bottom, Pisgah, Mt. Nebo, Double Springs, Big Lick, Union and Mt. Pleasant. Those eight churches had a combined total of 325 members. Mt. Pleasant Church was only one week old and had twenty-six members.
