Following Christ: Losing Your Life for His Sake by Charles H. Spurgeon



Charles H. Spurgeon was born in 1834 in England and died in 1892 at the age of fiftyseven. He remains, even today, one of the most published preachers in history. A person does not have to read many current Christian authors to discover Spurgeon is still, not only widely read, but often quoted. Spurgeon was a prolific writer and speaker who preached to an estimated ten million people in his lifetime.

If you have read books written in earlier times, then you already know the vernacular of these books can be difficult for the modern reader to follow and comprehend. In an effort to make this book more approachable to the modern reader, it has been annotated and updated. I personally found this helpful as it enabled me to focus on the message rather than the language.

In Following Christ, Spurgeon addresses what it means to follow Christ. He begins in chapter one by stating frankly that if we belong to Christ, we are expected to serve Christ. As he moves through the book, it seems he is anticipating the objections readers might have to his straightforward message, even though it is based solely on Scripture. Spurgeon addresses not only the need for believers to serve but how to serve, reliance on the Holy Spirit, and the use of our talents.

Spurgeon tells his readers that not only are we expected to serve Christ but being a child of God should touch and influence every area of our lives and every minute of our days. He stresses the importance of boldly including Christ into our every conversation and states quite plainly that if we were to do so, the world would feel the impact of Christianity.

It is impossible to read this book and not feel convicted. Spurgeon has a direct, nononsense approach that gives his readers an insight into what it must have been like to hear him speak in person. Spurgeon's books are still available from major retailers as well as offered on online bible study sites.

In closing, I have a recommendation for ereaders. I was able to receive this book for free digitally. There are numerous daily emails you can sign up for that send out free or bargain digital offers, including nonfiction and religious books! If you don't mind reading on your electronic device, this is a great way to build your library.
