A Word from our DOM

Dear CBA Churches,

As we enter the month of February, we often consider the month closely associated with Love because of St. Valentine's Day. I remember as a kid having a Valentine's Day party and sharing a Valentine card with all of my classmates. As a 7 or 8 year old child we would never say or write anything related to "loving each other", that would have just been weird. In some ways just doing activity to celebrate the day of love seemed to be sufficient. Friends, sometimes we allow the cultural influences to spill over to the church and our spiritual life. As Children of God and committed followers of Jesus, we recognize that true love is God's character. We also realize that once lesus is our Lord that Love becomes our new nature. So what does this Love of God look like and how does it impact our life? Well let's start with the scriptures. When reviewing I John 4:7-14 we see the following:

"7 Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. 8 The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love. 9 By this the love of God was manifested in us, that God has sent His]only begotten Son into the world so that we might live through Him. 10 In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. 11 Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. 12 No one has seen God at any time; if we love one another, God abides in us, and His love is perfected in us. 13 By this we know that we abide in Him and He in us, because He has given us of His Spirit. 14 We have seen and testify that the Father has sent the Son to be the Savior of the world."

- Love is from God (7)
- God is love (8)
- Without love you cannot know God (8)
- He sent us Jesus (9)
- He abides in us (12)
- God gives the gift of the Holy Spirit and His Son Jesus to be our savior

How God's Love Impacts Christ Followers:

- We will love one another (7&11)
- If we belong to God we must love (8)
- We live in Jesus (9)
- God's love is perfected in us (12)
- We are saved from our sins by Jesus and we have the Holy Spirit (10&13&14)

The challenge for February and the months to come is to allow God's perfect love to live through each of us. May God richly bless you, your family, church and community as you live and share God's love!

2023 Children's Camp



Living the Extraordinary Life: Nine Principles to Discover it by Charles Stanley



Extraordinary can be defined as very unusual or remarkable, exceptional, amazing, and astonishing. In this book, Charles Stanley tells us that for believers there is an expanded definition. "It is the life sustained by an inner peace and joy in the good times as well as the bad," (Stanley, 2005, p xiii).

If given a choice, most of us would choose a life well lived, meaningful, fulfilling, purposeful, and with a lasting legacy. In this book, Stanley tells us we are given a choice and that we can choose a life well-lived. The Bible is filled with principles and promises given to us for the purpose of improving our lives. What Stanley has done in this book is focus on nine "timetested truths" beginning with completely surrendering to God, (Stanley, 2005, p xiii). He talks about the importance of abiding in Christ, the ways God speaks to us, and the depth and magnitude of God's love for us.

As Stanley progresses through his nine principles, he covers trust in God, obedience, waiting for God, prayer, God's refining fire, and the Bible as the source of life.

Each chapter concludes with a list of suggested Scriptures for further study, a prayer, and journaling questions.

I find Charles Stanley's books to be solidly Bible-based, practical, and written with the average believer in mind. His books are a definite read whenever I find one. Even though this book was written in 2005, I found it on Amazon and christianbook.com. It would be an excellent choice for personal or small group study.

No Sweat Evangelism: Own Your Role as a Missionary

I recently went online and looked at the Georgia Baptist Convention's website. They have an evangelism training called, "No Sweat Evangelism." In their training they have four steps to make sharing Jesus simple. In this article I will briefly share their first step.

Step One: Own your role as a missionary. A. View yourself biblically.

We may never go to a foreign country but we are all called to be on mission with Christ. The Bible says, "Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God" (2 Corinthians 5:20). "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the excellences of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). We need to be reminded that God has called us to be His witnesses. God has given to each Christian the ministry of reconciliation.

B. Kill the A. N. T. S.

Ants stand for: Any Negative Thoughts. There are the ANTS of "You Can't." The enemy doesn't want us to share our faith. We are in a spiritual battle for the souls of men, women, boys and girls. The devil will tell us we don't know enough to share our faith. He will convince us that we are not smart enough to answer any questions that might come up, so we just need to remain silent. We need to exterminate that thought. If we have been saved we have the word of God and the Holy Spirit of God, and we can be a witness for Christ.

There are also the ANTS of comparison. We have all heard that voice in our head that says, "I just can't share the gospel like so and so." I am not eloquent enough to share the gospel. I need to let them do it. They do a much better job.

We need to understand that the Lord has given to each one of us a sphere of influence. God has placed us in the lives of people that He wants us to reach.

There is another big ANT that many of us deal with. It is the "ant of fear." The Scripture says, "For God has not given us the spirit of fear, but of power and of love, and of a sound mind" (2 Timothy 1:7). I know in my own life there have been many times when I have chickened out of sharing the gospel. I always feel so guilty when I walk away from those encounters. I have learned through the years that most people are open to discuss spiritual matters if we will just overcome our fear.

C. You must invite accountability.

We need to give someone permission to hold us accountable to share the gospel. We need those in our lives to ask us, who have you personally shared Christ with this week? When I know there are those who are going to be asking me that question, it will help me to be more faithful at being a witness. Let me encourage you to make it a priority in 2023 to be a consistent, persistent witness for Christ.
