Outreach Toolbox: Preschool Playgroup



We moved to Mid-Missouri almost six years ago. At the time, we had two children under three years old. Nine months later we welcomed our third child. Over the next year, my wife, Allison, was home with one or more sick babies as many Sundays as she was at church. I was meeting new people and growing to love our community, while she felt isolated and stuck at home.

As the kids grew, Allison was able to get out of the house more. She soon discovered she was not the only mom who longed for friendships. During this time, our staff was trying to develop creative ways to both minister to our city and get new people comfortable with coming to our church building. Allison had the idea for a time when moms of preschoolers could meet at our church for fellowship, while their small children played. Soon, Pre-School Playtime was born.


Every second and fourth Monday, during the school year, a group of moms (and the occasional dad and grandmom) come with their children to our church building. Play areas are set up in different stations throughout the gym. Tables are also set-up for the parents to sit and talk while they watch their children play. It is a time dedicated to fun and fellowship.

This isn't meant to be an advertisement for one of our programs. The intent is for this to be an encouragement to our CBA churches. Our "playtime" has grown over the past few years. We now regularly have 30+ parents and kids during the scheduled time. What has been especially encouraging is that most of the moms/grandmoms/dads who come are not regular church attenders! Allison has been able to build friendships and share Christ's love with many other moms. We recently have seen several of the moms come to worship services, or participate in other ministry programs.

I will admit that in the past, I've been close to falling into the trap of thinking most people who do not attend church have no interest. God has used our playtime as another reminder to me that I should always be looking for new ways to help meet the spiritual needs not only of our members, but also our community. Outreach is vital to every church. Don't forget that outreach can, and should include using your building as a ministry tool. Whether it's a Pre-school Playtime or any of the dozens more types of programs, I hope you will consider praying about new ways to use your building to minister to your community. Show them your church's "home" is a place where they can find friendship, love and the Savior.


Knowing God by J. I. Packer



J.I. Packer, born in England in 1926, was an extremely prolific writer and theologian who, among other things, served as general editor for the English Standard Version of the Bible. His best known book of the one hundred sixtyfive he wrote is Knowing God.

In the beginning of this book, Packer states very plainly that the majority of Christians today have a shallow, superficial knowledge of God. Knowing God was written to address this issue by introducing readers to a deeper knowledge of God. It is divided into three parts. The first is devoted to the subject of knowing God: how to know if you know God, evidence of knowing God, and being known by God. In the second part, Packer takes a deep dive into the character of God detailing His love, grace, wisdom, wrath, goodness, and jealousy. The third section of the book focuses on our relationship with God. He expands on the heart of the gospel, the concepts of adoption, justification, and propitiation, and concludes with a strong focus on the book of Romans.

Packer does not hesitate to call Christians out for common misconceptions they may be harboring. He includes liberal use of scripture to support a common theme of the book in how vital a thorough knowledge of God's Word is to our knowledge of God.



Knowing God, originally written in 1973, is considered one of the classics of Christian literature and is still widely available from most major retailers. My copy of the book was updated and revised using scriptural references in the Revised Standard Version rather than the original King James.

Reading this book is not a casual, superficial look at God. This is a in-depth learning of who God is and how we can know Him in a deeper, more intimate way. Knowing God is a strong contender for our church's summer book study, I am looking forward to the discussions it inspires.

Missouri Baptist Heritage Scholarship

Something is Coming Soon in our Association that has never happened before and will not happen again!

Two hundred years ago, in October 1823, the Concord Baptist Association was organized. Saturday, October 14, 2023, from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm, we will be celebrating this event in many special ways. The location is High Point Baptist church, just west of the "Business District" on Highway C, which is the only street in town!

Lunch will be catered, so no attendees will have to bring a covered dish. This event is designed for entire families. Childcare will be provided for babies to pre-school. There will be lots of music, vignette(s), theme interpretation from past, present and future, Children's Bible Drill, a missions testimony from one of our own young ladies, and an extremely interesting keynote speaker.

Right after lunch, we will have a decorated cake and cupcakes, followed by activites from the past and present for all people attending (none of us know what the young people will be doing in the future for entertainment). There will also be a program in the afternoon.

Make plans to bring several from your church family....remember: this has never happened before and will not happen again, so don't miss this event!

Since this is also typically when the CBA Annual meeting is held, an abbreviated business session will be held from 9:00-9:45am at the same location. There will be several pieces of important business to be voted upon by the Executive Council and the messengers from CBA churches. It is a tight schedule, so please don't arrive late!

A History of Concord Baptist Association

After the anti-missions problem was settled in Concord Baptist Association, reaching people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ became very important in the churches of the Association. During the years 1842 and 1843, the churches of Concord Baptist Association baptized a total of 1,209 new believers: 397 in 1842, and 712 in 1843. In 1843, seven churches baptized 50 or more. Sardis (now Elston Baptist Church) led the Association in baptisms with 98 in 1843. Others were Moreau 81, Bethel 56, Gilgal 52, Cole Springs 51, and Mt. Pleasant 50. More information is included in *A History of Concord Baptist Association.*
