
Paula and I wish a wonderful Christ focused Resurrection celebration to each and every one of you. What a joyous time to praise our Lord and Savior.

## On Evangelism: The Sending Savior



The Bible tells us, "Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then His disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. So Jesus said to them again, 'Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you" (John 20:19-21 NKJV).

The moment we are saved we become an ambassador for Christ. "Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God" (2 Corinthians 5:20 NKJV). As children of God we represent His Kingdom in a foreign land.

Who was Jesus sending? He was sending His disciples. He is still sending us today. In the Book of Acts He told His disciples, "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit

comes upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). We are His sent ones today.

Where did He send them? The Lord sent them to go into all of the world and be His witness. He sends us today to share the gospel with all those we come in contact. Wherever we go we should leave a gospel trail. We may not always have the opportunity to share a full gospel presentation but we can leave a gospel trail by leaving a gospel tract or a copy of the gospel of John.



## Book Review: Holier Than Thou by Jackie Hill Perry



What we believe about the holiness of God affects our faith, our trust, and our own holiness. In this book, Jackie Hill Perry does more than take a superficial look into God's holiness, she dives in and explores God's holiness using scripture as her guide.

In the first chapter, she focuses on Isaiah chapter six in which Isaiah recounts his vision of heaven, in particular Isaiah's response to finding himself in the presence of God. He immediately confesses his sinful, unclean state without God saying a word. Peter had a similar reaction after Jesus told him to let down his nets again in Luke chapter five.

After giving us a clear picture of God and His holiness, Perry moves to address our views of God and how common misconceptions affect

our holiness. "As incomparable as God is, it seems to me that one problem with us humans is that we become so used to the idea of God that we treat Him as commonplace," (Perry, 2021 p. 72).

Perry's writing is logical and easy to follow. There is a clear progression toward her goal that we would become holy. It is apparent that she has spent a considerable amount of time studying scriptures and reading other well-known Bible scholars, whom she quotes frequently throughout the book.

Perry gives us much to contemplate on the importance of holiness. One point specifically jumped off the page for me in the beginning of chapter five on Holy Justice. "Starting a gospel presentation with 'Do you know that you are a sinner?' is the wrong way to begin... we should—dare I say must—begin with 'Did you know that God is holy?"" (Perry, 2021 p. 105).

Holier Than Thou is definitely a worthwhile read. It has a great deal of teachings concerning God and His Holiness, and Perry does an excellent job of unpacking them to point us in the right direction. This book is available from major retailers; there is also a workbook available for anyone wishing to make this a personal or small group study.
