"And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." (Romans 8:28, NASB 1995)



Book Review:
"Now That's a Good
Question by RC Sproul




This book was based on a radio program featuring Dr. Sproul in which invited attendees were given the opportunity to ask any theological question, and he provided an answer in a four-minute time period. Later the transcript was organized and edited, and this book was the result. There are twenty-two chapters covering subjects ranging from God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit to marriage, career, suffering, and the end times.

Dr. Sproul, founder of Ligonier Ministries and author of over one hundred books, gave straightforward, easily understood answers. He routinely covered differences between beliefs held by the Roman Catholic Church and Protestants on the different subjects addressed and at times the differences among various Protestant Churches.

I was impressed by Dr. Sproul's depth of knowledge as well as his willingness to open himself up to spontaneous questions on difficult subjects often avoided. His answers revealed a deep understanding of Scripture and were based on the Bible rather than personal opinion though he did give his opinion at times. He was very articulate in his answers on the wide variety of subjects, and he readily acknowledged which areas were often the subject of disagreement such as infant baptism.

Now That's A Good Question was published in 1996 and is still widely available from major retailers. It was an interesting read and would be an excellent resource to have in your personal library.

On Evangelism: Holding Up the light

Have you ever thought about why you are here? What is your purpose in life? The Scriptures tell us why we are here. Christ followers are to be light in this dark and wicked world. God has left us down here to shine. We are not here to buy and sell and get gain, to accumulate wealth, to acquire worldly position. This world, if we are Christians, is not our home, we are just passing through. God has sent us into the world to shine for Him. lesus said, "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men , that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:14-16). The Bible says, "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8).

I read a story this past week of a sailor who became very seasick. While he was sick, he heard that a man had fallen overboard. He was wondering if there was anything he could do to help save the man. He laid hold of a light, and held it up to the porthole. The drowning man was saved. A few days later when the sick man got over his sickness, he went up on the deck and talked to the man that had been saved. The saved man gave this testimony. He said he had gone down the second time and was just going down again for the last time, when he put out his hand. Just then, he said, someone held

a light at the porthole, and the light fell on it. A sailor caught him by the hand and pulled him into the lifeboat.

It seemed a small thing to do to hold up the light; yet it saved the man's life. We may think there is not much we can do to make a difference in this dark world but we can hold the light for some poor hell bound sinner who may be won to Christ and delivered from destruction. We need to take the torch of salvation and go into the homes and hold up Christ to the people as the Savior of the world. If the lost are going to be reached, we must go where they are and pray and labor for them. I heard about a blind man who was sitting on a street corner with a lantern beside him. Someone went up to him and asked him what he had a lantern for, seeing that he was blind the light was the same to him as the darkness. The blind man replied, "I have it so that no one may stumble over me."

The Apostle Paul said "You are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read by all men" (2 Corinthians 3:2). Think about what Paul is saying. Where one man reads the Bible there are a hundred that read you and me. If we are to be light in this world we must match our walk with our talk. God forbid we be a stumbling block to anyone coming to Christ! May our light so shine that the lost see their way to Christ!
