A Word from our DOM

Dear CBA Churches,

The 4th of July was always my father's favorite holiday. My dad was raised on a farm in southeast Missouri during the depression. Like many families being raised in the 1930's, times were tough and money was scarce. As a farmer, Christmas and Easter were challenging times on the family farm and there was little money. But the 4th of July was a slower time on the farm since the crops were in the field. The family could get together and celebrate. My grandparents would generally have a few extra dollars to buy soda, ice and made homemade ice cream for the fourth. The country's freedom and the freedom to have a day set aside to spend with family was very special to my family as it was to many of you and your family.

Our Country's independence and the celebration of freedom is wonderful. But as committed followers of Jesus and American's we are able to celebrate something even greater. While the political freedoms we receive as a country is the best in the world, there is something greater. As a Born Again Believer in Jesus and as an American, we are blessed to. celebrate the best of both world's. We live in a country that celebrates the freedom of a great country but most importantly we celebrate the eternal freedom for which we receive through Jesus when we accept salvation when He died for our sins, was buried and rose from the grave.

"It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery." (Gal 5:1) I always thought that this passage was powerful, but also kind of awkward. What does it really mean? "It was for Freedom that Christ set us free...". Salvation is as simple as that. 

Book Review: What Every Christian Should Know About the Return of Jesus



Rob Phillips, who works for the Missouri Baptist Convention and lives in Jefferson City, has written a number of Christian books on a variety of subjects. His latest book focuses on the return of Jesus. While Christians readily agree on the fact of Jesus' return, we seem to fall into one of two camps: either we are fascinated with the end times and eagerly study the subject or we prefer not to think about it and avoid it altogether. Whichever camp you fall into this book was written for you. At the beginning, Phillips clearly states he has deliberately avoided timelines and details that usually prove divisive (particularly the four different millennialist views which are explained in an appendix for those wishing for more information). He quotes John 21:20-23 as proof we are not meant to know the exact time and his approach in this book reflects that

belief. Phillips tells us, "...the wise listener focuses not on the day or hour of Christ's return but on being ready for his return whenever it comes," (Phillips, 2023 p. 386).

Phillips gives us an in-depth look into everything the Bible tells us about Jesus' return, beginning with an examination of the scriptures that focus on the fact of His return. After establishing this fact, he focuses on how Jesus will return: personally, powerfully, victoriously, and suddenly. Along the way, he answers questions such as: what is Sheol? Is it Hell or a different place, and what about Hades? What is the difference between the Great White Throne Judgment and the Judgment Seat of Christ? What are we supposed to be doing while we wait for his return?

I thoroughly enjoyed this book, and I learned much about the return of Jesus I didn't know or hadn't thought about. Phillips' goal seems to be to educate believers on the end times, and that is exactly what he has done. He reminds us, "It's not that we don't look forward to the return of Christ; it's that we don't look forward to it as often or as intently as we should," (Phillips, 2023 p. 324).

Each chapter ends with a review of that chapter's main points and study questions. This would be an excellent study for a group wishing to know more about the return of Jesus. It is available online from Amazon.
