Book Review: You Are Never Alone by Max Lucado



In this book, Max Lucado takes a look at the miracles found in the Gospel of John and, in doing so reminds us, "you're stronger than you think because God is nearer than you know," (Lucado, 2020 p 6).

Each miracle contains a powerful emphasis of dependence on God's presence and His power in our lives. Along the way, Lucado offers a unique perspective on miracles many of us are very familiar with and asks questions such as why would Jesus bother with turning water into wine at a wedding? Because it was important to his mother and, if it was important to her, it was important to Him. Lucado reminds us in the healing of the Official's son that sometimes it is a long walk between offered prayer and answered prayer. Each miracle explored contains a timely lesson for us and for our lives.

The last four chapters focus on events found at the end of John: the crucifixion, resurrection of Jesus, and the restoration of Peter. He concludes with a message we all need to hear,



All these events stand together as one voice, cheering you on, calling on you to believe that this miracleworking God cares for you, fights for you, and will come to your aid

(Lucado, 2020 p 133)



Lucado tells us in the opening pages that he completed this book in the days of Covid and quarantine, an event which made the isolation and loneliness people were already feeling even more pronounced. His reminder is when we question whether God knows, God cares or is even aware of our situations, the answer is always a resounding yes!

Lucado has kept his chapters relatively short, and they, as always, are written with the layperson in mind. There is a study guide in the book, but there is also a separate study guide with video available.
