The 200th Anniversary Celebration of Concord Baptist Association on October 14th was a huge recognition to all the churches that are a part of the CBA - past, present, and future. The planning team has met every month since January 2022, and Roy Dameron has spent countless hours over the span of years researching, writing, and editing a wonderful history book that can still be purchased. One hundred and ninety-four attended the day-long celebration at High Point, representing thirty-three churches. Some former staff members traveled from various places to celebrate with us. Volunteers from thirty-one associational churches plus seven guests helped make the day's activities possible. No covered dishes needed to be brought as Matt Coley, with a missions calling to not charge for food preparation, used his traveling grills along with kitchen help for all of us to enjoy. Outside activities were available after the meal, plus decorated cake and cupcakes.

The celebration was full of music, which included the 45/200 Choir, which had many singers from several churches. Several changes had to be made at the last minute, but dedicated musicians did a wonderful job sharing their musical talent.

Other highlights from the day included hearing from a young missionary from New Hope, who shared about her trip to Kenya. This fall she will leave for another mission field. Jerry Cain was the keynote speaker and shared his love for history and the scripture in a very humorous way. "Walking Backwards into the Future" was his message, reminding us to remember and honor our past as we walk into the future as an association of churches.

Always Be Ready

There is probably no Christian discipline that brings more anxiety to a Christian than evangelism. When we ask people to share their faith, most will break into a cold sweat. It has been my observation that many people in the church will take a class on how to share their faith but when they are asked to practice what they have learned, they freeze up. Why is it so difficult to share our faith? Why are we so timid to tell others about the gospel?

I completely understand the fear that grips a person's heart when challenged to go and share the gospel. When I was first saved my pastor told me that I needed to join them on Thursday evenings for outreach. I had only been saved two weeks the first time I showed up. The pastor asked me when I got there if I knew a certain individual and if I knew where they lived. I was more than eager to tell him in the affirmative to both questions. As soon as I did fear began to overtake me. Why? I realized he was going to send me there to talk to this man whom I knew very well. I used to drink with him in the local tavern. All the way to his house I was praying that he would not be at home!

The pastor sent me with another man who knew how to share the gospel and told me to just go as a silent prayer partner. This was how I could learn to witness. When we arrived that evening the man met us at the door with a cold beer in his hand and said, "Mike, how are you doing. Come on in. Who is your friend? Can I

get you a cold beer?" I didn't know what to say, other than, "No, thank you. I trusted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior a couple of weeks ago, and my friend is going to tell you all about it!" That is all I knew about being a witness at that time.

My friend didn't get saved that evening, but that experience really nailed down my commitment to Jesus and to become a soul winner. I knew from that time forward the old crowd was talking about me, and they were watching me. They were taking bets on how long this religious thing was going to last. By the grace of God, it has lasted for 43 years!


1 Peter 3:15 tells us, "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear." Peter tells us to always be ready, always prepared. Preparation takes time. I want to challenge us to stop making excuses of why we can't tell others the good news of the gospel, and to take the time to prepare. The more we prepare and make ourselves available, the more the Lord will be able to use us to lead others to Himself.

God didn't take us to heaven the moment we were saved because He wants us to share the "Good News" with the lost so that they may be saved!

Book Review: Trembling Faith by Taylor Turkington



There are moments for each of us when the world seems chaotic and out of control; when it feels like evil is winning, and God is far away. In this book, Taylor Turkington points us to the Old Testament book of Habakkuk. Only three chapters long, Habakkuk is far from the longest book in the Bible nor is it the most popular or most often read. But in these three chapters, Turkington helps us find hope midst life's crises, injustice, and corruption.

Habakkuk lived in a world filled with chaos and injustice. The leadership in Judah was corrupt and the nation as a whole had refused to heed God's warnings to repent. As a prophet of God, Habakkuk knew God's judgment was coming in the form of the Babylonian empire. Through Habakkuk's conversation with God, we learn how to put

our faith and trust in God even when we don't understand or maybe even don't like what He is doing.

"Habakkuk shows us God isn't distant or apathetic and never dismissive in our search for hope. The King of the World is listening,"

(Turkington 2023, p. 60)

As Turkington walks us through the book of Habakkuk, she reminds us that God is faithful, God keeps His promises, and God always acts in our best interests regardless of the circumstances in which we find ourselves. "If we are stripped of everything, what then? Still faith, Habakkuk says. Faith and joy," (Turkington 2023, p.191). I feel like we all need the reminder that joy is a choice we make and, as believers, we should always choose God and choose joy.

Trembling Faith is Taylor Turkington's first book. A definite worthwhile read on an often neglected book of the Bible.
