



Book Review: Spiritual Disciplines by Mason King




When I began reading this book, I quickly realized it was not going to be your typical book on Spiritual Disciplines. Mason King approaches the subject from a more holistic viewpoint than we often see. He begins with a simple but powerful reminder, "God doesn't tolerate you. God loves you," (King, 2023 p 2). The recurring theme throughout the book is God's love, in that He loves today. He isn't waiting for us to progress to a point we become lovable; His love for us is constant.

King begins his look on Spiritual Disciplines by focusing on our attention. If we are being honest, this is a subject that should resonate. He very frankly addresses the digital distractions we carry in our pockets and our tendency to give attention to our phones rather than people and sometimes even our church service. He cautions us about busyness for Jesus over relationship with Jesus, the importance of making Bible reading

a lifelong habit, trusting God with our every emotion, and practicing Sabbath rest.

I particularly appreciated King's thoughts on praying the Psalms:



In this book, Mason King gives a fresh look at a commonly addressed subject. He closes with this reminder, "Becoming a healthy Christian is a lifelong process of change, day by day," (King, 2023 p 172). Each chapter closes with discussion questions for personal or group use. This would be a worthy addition to your personal library and a definite contender to be added to your rotation of books that are reread often.
