

Book Review: Loving God With All Your Mind by Efizabeth George

If you have ever felt overwhelmed by negative thoughts of worry, frustration, or depression, then this book was written with you in mind. Elizabeth George knows from experience that, "Like a virus, your thoughts can drain your energy and cripple your usefulness," (George 1994, p. 22).

She gives us the six scriptures that were particularly meaningful to her as she struggled with depression and were instrumental in her journey to a healthy mental outlook.

In her examination of each scripture, George emphasizes the importance of memorization and meditation as well as obedience.

"What I offer in this book are six powerful Scriptures that have brought stability, strength...and sweet peace...into my life and into the lives of others"

(George 1994, p. 9)

There is a strong thread of autobiographical content as she shares her personal experiences

to teach biblical truths. These truths include filtering out thoughts that are not true and filling your mind with God's Word, how to win the battle with worry, what we should remember to forget, and how to focus on God's goodness and His plan for your life.

I appreciated Elizabeth George's candor and openness in her writing. By using her personal testimony, she places herself firmly in the mindset of her readers and offers hope to those who find themselves at the mercy of unhealthy thoughts or a dismal outlook on life.

Elizabeth George has written over eighty books and bible studies for women. This book was an updated and expanded edition of the original book published in 1994. There is a study guide available as well as a DVD which has an interactive workbook. If your women's group is looking for a study this one would not disappoint.

Missions Corner: El Salvador



"How can we partner together?" is the main question Pastor Jared Rivera is wanting to get from the "vision" mission trip he recently took to El Salvador.

Rivera, pastor of the First Baptist Church in Tipton, went on the 11-day mission trip, spending eight of those days in El Salvador, He was joined by Concord Baptist Association members, Alan Earls, director of missions, Ken McCune, interim pastor at Jamestown, and Heber Menam previous pastor of High Point Baptist Church and executive director at Maxwell Leadership.

The team went on the mission trip with a plan to meet with dozens of pastors from the Guatemalan border to the border of Honduras, places that Rivera said were "less developed and with a lot of poverty." The goal of the trip was to find out what the country needed, spiritually and physically. Additionally, they want to partner with the Baptist Association of El Salvador.

"There are a lot of opportunities for us as Christians to help in the center of the country," said Rivera. "Despite the civil war not long ago in the area, El Salvador has developed, along with gaining a new president, Bernardo Arevalo, who has turned the country around." El Salvador is now equipped with a world-class prison, has ridden itself of the power struggle with the gang activity, has strongly armed National Guard and is living with a lot more peace.

Rivera said there are still endless spiritual and physical needs to be had in El Salvador, while "raising a new generation of believers."

While on the vision trip, Rivera learned that there was a lot of "church planting," people who were just "pastoring" without the background. We want to be able to share the kingdom," said Rivera. "A ministry that has sustainability. We want to build up everyrthing they're doing, not take over."



Rivera explained that the big issues in El Salvador with the kids is technology and work. They are dealing with the reality of the economic status they deal with. Other issues are found from other religious antagonists who are looking to manipulate and take advantage of the lower class.

While in El Salvador, Rivera, Mena and Earls were also able to bless a few families and churches with donations they had taken with them. The Concord Baptist Association will be raising money to send people back to help their community, to partner with them instead of belittle the country.

"We don't want to just throw money at them," said Rivera. We want to see a significant healthy effect." The missionaries want to see the people and communities of El Salvador grow and be sustainable, to reach the whole country. "We can learn from their passion while they learn from our experience," said Rivera."I expect in this partnership we will end up being more blessed."

This is Rivera's second international mission trip, going to Cambodia in 2018.

The Concord Baptist Association has been approved to start pursuing the partnership with El Salvador, and in its second year, Rivera's list of mission trips overseas will get to grow. "We want to be able to launch goals," said Rivera. "The big thing is to help them but also given them the option to do it how they want."

How Can You Prepare?

On January 18, 2024 the CBA Executive Council voted to start the process to enter into a partnership with El Salvador. This is an exciting opportunity for our churches to be involved in sharing the Hope of Christ and assisting our sister churches in El Salvador. Be praying for how God may use you in this partnership. The first step is obviously prayer. As God reveals to you a peace of how you and your church can be involved, be prepared. How can you prepare?

- 1. Pray
- 2. Ensure you have a Passport.
- 3. Be open to consider ways as to how God may use you:
 - Personally prepare to go on a trip to El Salvador
 - Create a Prayer wall.
 - Be willing to provide Spanish Speaking Discipleship and Evangelism Material.
 - If you can't go perhaps consider sponsoring someone to go.
 - Work together with other churches to create a team if you don't have enough in your own church.
 - If you are fluent in Spanish consider going as an interpreter.
 - Be willing to teach and seek to train leaders to be able to teach others.
 - Be willing to participate in a building project, medical mission, teaching a theological class; serve in a regional workshop to assist in increased discipleship.
 - Other ways to share Jesus and to make disciples

We will be providing more information as we get close to the agreement and would encourage all of our churches to support this associational partnership in anyway your church feels led.
