Registration (ends 6/21): \$110/camper


Registration will run March 1st - June 21st. No registrations will be accepted after the cut-off, so register early!



Dr. Rodriguez and I had the privilege to sign the partnership agreement between Concord Baptist Association and the El Salvador Baptist Association.  - Create a Prayer wall.
 - Be willing to provide Spanish Speaking Discipleship and Evangelism Material.
 - If you can't go perhaps consider sponsoring someone to go.
 - Work together with other churches to create a team if you don't have enough in your own church.
 - If you are fluent in Spanish consider going as an interpreter.
 - Be willing to teach and seek to train leaders to be able to teach others.
 - Be willing to participate in a building project, medical mission, teaching a theological class; serve in a regional workshop to assist in increased discipleship.
 - Other ways to share Jesus and to make disciples

Youth/Associate Pastor, Fortuna Baptist



Book Review: The Insanity of God by Nik Riphen with Greg Lewis



The Insanity of God is the fascinating and convicting story of the author's journey of faith. The story begins in rural Kentucky where he grew up part of a 'poor and proud' Kentucky family. After marrying, Nik Ripken and his family spent fifteen years serving on the mission fields of Africa. Much of that time was spent in Somaliland which was undergoing a civil war that had devastated the country and the people. The magnitude of what the people of Somaliland were experiencing was overwhelming: starvation, death, and hatred. The struggle to find resources to help them was constant. Many relief agencies refused to enter the country until it was safe for their workers. It seemed that evil was so in control it was difficult to find God at work. By the time Ripken and his family left Africa, they had felt such loss and grief they were questioning if God was at work in the world today. "Everything in my background told me that if I trained better, worked harder, prayed longer, sacrificed more,

and sowed more widely, God would grant an abundant spiritual harvest. But that did not happen in Somaliland," (Ripken 2013, p. 128).

After returning to the United States, Ripken and his wife decided they needed answers to the questions that plagued them. This led to Ripken visiting a number of countries that were known to persecute Christians. He visited Russia, several Eastern European countries, China, other Asian countries, and the Middle East. He spoke to and interviewed hundreds of believers living with the reality of persecution. What he found changed him. He found that the stronger the persecution, the stronger the believers who lived there.



"Looking back now, I understand that one of the most accurate ways to detect and measure the activity of God is to note the amount of opposition that is present. The stronger the persecution, the more significant the spiritual vitality of the believers,"

(Ripken 2013, p.153)



This is an extremely convicting book that should be on the must-read list of every Christian. It shines a light on our complacency and comfort and reminds us of our God-given purpose. This book was made into a movie which is still available from a variety of sources.

On Evangelism: Fishing with Jesus

In Mark's gospel we are told that as Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he called out Simon and his brother Andrew to follow Him. He said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you become fishers of men" (Mark 1:17). Jesus went a little farther along the seashore, and He saw John the son of Zebedee. John and his brother were fishermen too, and He also called them to come follow Him (Mark 1:19). In both cases the Bible says they immediately left what they were doing and followed Him (Mark 1:18; 20). When Jesus called, they left their livelihoods and everything familiar to them. The Bible doesn't say they asked any questions or debated. The Scripture says they immediately followed Him!

Jesus told these men who made their living catching fish that He would make them fishers of men. Their job was to follow. Jesus' job was to make them become fishers of men. The word of God teaches us that every Christian is to be fishing. The old saying says, "If we are following, we are fishing. If we are not fishing, we are not following."

I am not an expert fisherman. I do know that it takes different baits for different types of fish. I know that weather can make a difference whether fish are biting or not. The water temperature is a factor if the fish are biting near the surface or the closer to the bottom. Some days fishing will be better than others. If you are fishing in an unfamiliar place, a guide may be able to determine if you are able to catch fish or not.

This analogy is the same when you are fishing

for men. It takes different bait for different men. A friend who is now a deacon said it was a round orange basketball that hooked him for Jesus. He was asked by a fishing pastor if he would like to play basketball on a church team. The stipulation was that he had to come to church at least twice a month to play.

It is a lot of fun to hook a big fish and then land it. It is even more exciting to fish for men and see a person receive Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior! We always talk about the ones we land, but very seldom do we talk about ones who get away. What we need to realize is we haven't failed when results are not what we desire. Success is being obedient to do what God has called us to do.

I recently preached a revival service. The pastor I served with was a consistent fisher of men. We spent every afternoon knocking on doors in the community. We knocked on several doors where no one was home. We knocked on many doors where people were not interested. Most people were not biting. We knocked on a few doors where the people were friendly and polite. They allowed us to share the gospel but would not receive Jesus and be saved. We did have two people who were ready! They received Christ and were gloriously saved. To God be the glory!

Think about it! When we go fishing for men, Jesus Himself goes with us to be our guide. He already knows all about the people where we will be fishing. He empowers us to share the gospel. He is the One who sets the hook and saves them. He cleans His own fish, and we get to be in on it! I love fishing with Jesus. They are the best fishing trips I have ever been on.


