

Book Review: Final Conquest by Dr. Robert Jeffress



The book of Revelation is not the most frequently read book of the Bible nor is it the most easily understood. In fact, many Christians avoid Revelation because while it contains much they do not understand, what they do understand involves judgment, scary creatures, and even scarier consequences.

In this book, Dr. Robert Jeffress, Senior Minister at First Baptist Church in Dallas, Texas, takes a verse-by-verse look at the book of Revelation. His goal is not to frighten his readers but to encourage them, remind them of God's love and desire for fellowship with His children. Jeffress also reminds unbelievers the door to salvation will not always be open. There will be a day when it will be too late.

In a time when our world often seems chaotic, Jeffress tells us,

"God has the future under complete control, just as He has your life under complete control, even when it seems to be spinning out of control,"

(Jeffress 2020, p. 178)

It is a reassuring reminder.

Jeffress avoids opinions, concentrating on what can be proven from the Scriptures. When discussing verses that are often the subject of disagreement, he is careful to outline the different beliefs and then state the reasons and Scriptures to support what he believes to be true.

Dr. Jeffress has done a remarkable job making approachable a book often considered unapproachable. Whether this is your first serious study of Revelation or not, this book is well worth your time. Along with the book, you may want to consider the accompanying DVD series. It contains 27 episodes, one for each chapter, and, therefore, is a time commitment but listening to his sermons is valuable especially for a large or small group study.
