

We will be voting on several key items, including the 2025 Budget as well as the proposed revision of the Association Constitution, so we hope to see each church represented! Alternates may serve in the absence of any of the above.

A Word from our DOM

How quickly summer left us. It seemed that summer just began and now fall is fast approaching. The fast changes of seasons reminds me of Ecclesiastes 3:1, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."

Over the years I served as pastor, I would often remind the church family that as the church shared Christ's love to our community, that God had given the church an opportunity to reach our community for a season. Only God knew the length of the season. Much of the church's community ministry involved children. The children had no control of where they would move and how long they would stay. So, the church loved them for the season they were in. Sometimes the season was for only a few weeks, others a few months while yet others the season was abundant, and we saw them grow up. Regardless of the length of the season of the community ministry, each leader was encouraged to plant the seeds of Jesus and His truth for the season we had them. We would then trust the Lord for the results.

God's Holy Scripture reminds us:

So shall my word be that goes out of my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it.

(Isaiah 55:11)

Sometimes the assignments that God gives us may not result in measurable success as we work the task. Sometimes the investments that we make in a child or a family's life may never bear fruit for which we see. But every opportunity that God gives us to share the truth of His Word, His salvation, His love, forgiveness and desire for restoration, has a purpose. God's Word will never come back empty. God's Word will always accomplish what He purposes.

Churches, it is sometimes challenging to share our witness and the truth of God's word with our community, state, nation and world. We may never see the fruits of the labor that we invested. But please be encouraged in this, that God gives us a season, let us honor Him by doing all we can to work in the season that He has given. God doesn't make mistakes. God reveals His will, His purpose and will successfully accomplish the things that He has sent!



Book Review: In His Image by Jen Wilkin



A few months ago, I read and reviewed *None Like Him*, a book by Jen Wilkin that addressed God's attributes that are His alone; attributes we should not aspire toward because to do so is to try and become like Him, a god in our own right. This book, *In His Image*, serves as an excellent companion to None Like Him.

In His Image addresses the communicable attributes of God. These are the attributes and qualities He expects us to emulate and incorporate into our lives. Wilkin begins by connecting attributes such as holiness, love, peace, justice, and mercy to the will of God. She states her purpose for this book is for us to identify God's will in our lives, however, Wilkin gives us a view of God's will many of us may not have considered.

"Our inclination is to discern God's will by asking, 'What should I do?' But God's will concerns itself primarily with who we are, and only secondarily with what we do. By changing the question and asking, 'Who should I be?' we see that God's will is not concealed from us in his Word, but is plainly revealed," (Wilkin 2018, p. 20-21).

We should all strive to embrace these attributes and make them a part of our personal lives to not only impact our lives and walk with God but the lives of those around us. Wilkin concludes her book with a similar thought,



Everything we say or do will either illuminate or obscure the character of God.

(Wilkin 2018, p.153)



Each chapter concludes with a list of verses for meditation and questions for reflection; any individual or small group would find this book an excellent study.
