



EVANGELISM

"THE EARLY CHURCH WAS STRONG IN EVANGELISM"

The Bible says in Acts 2:47, "And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved." The early church had a passion for souls. They were committed to sharing the gospel. In Romans 1:16 Paul said, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek."

The churches priority should be winning the lost. Leonard Ravenhill said, "The early church had no great cathedrals in which to meet, no elaborate service, no ritual, no rigid liturgies, very little organization, no seminaries, hardly any New Testament Scriptures, but it had power. It had the power of an ungrieved Holy Spirit in its midst, and in less than 30 years it spread itself over the civilized world in face of entrenched dislike and growing hatred and scorn."

They had power because they were obedient. The inerrant Word of God demands obedience. Obedience demands evangelism.

I read that there are approximately 184,000 deaths per day worldwide. In the U.S. there are approximately 8,000 deaths per day. Every 12 seconds someone dies in the United States. Those statistics should drive us to share the gospel.

According to research that has been done among our Southern Baptist Churches, we have been told that most of our congregations are plateaued or declining. Several thousand of our churches did not baptize one person all year. Several thousand more baptized less than ten a year. We must ask ourselves what we are doing to reach the masses before it is eternally too late.

We need to ask God for an urgency and the boldness like a man I heard about during the Civil War. His name was Peter Apples. I do not recall what side he fought on. It was said of him that there was never any retreat in him. He always went ahead in the battle. The story went on to tell a battle where Peter's side was way outnumbered. As they engaged in the battle the bugle sounded out for Peter's side to retreat. Everyone did except for him. He ran straight ahead into danger, being fired upon. He ran to the other side and jumped down into a ditch where his enemy was. He hit the man, knocked him out, and threw him over his shoulder and ran back towards where his company was. The enemy would not shoot at him because they were afraid, they would shoot their own man.

When Peter made it back to his comrades, they asked him where in the world did you get him? He said, "Over yonder in that ditch! There are plenty of them over there. You can have one too if you want one!"

Let's be willing to go! There are plenty of lost souls out there. If we are willing to go, we will catch some!



FEAR NOT TOMORROW, GOD IS ALREADY THERE

First of all, a clarification: Ruth Graham's name may sound familiar because of evangelist Billy Graham as Ruth is Billy Graham's daughter. His wife, also named Ruth, and also an author, wrote her books under the name Ruth Bell Graham. In this book, Ruth Graham addresses how to trust God in uncertain times and how to deal with the fears that seem to follow us no matter what stage of life we are in. She explains the impact fear has on our lives, the antidote for fear, and God's desire for our lives to be free of fear. Throughout the book she uses examples from her life and her personal struggles to encourage us in our own circumstances. "Often in the Bible, when God exhorts people to 'fear not,' He gives this as His reason: 'I am with you' God's antidote for our fear is His presence—Himself," (Graham 2009, p. 31).

After reminding us of God's attitude toward fear, Graham turns her attention to how we should seek to replace fear with God's presence. "It is important to remember that it is not up to us to figure out how to achieve peace. Peace is not something that we do. It is something that He is," (Graham 2009, p.129). Graham gives us a powerful reminder that our focus should be on God and not on our fears.

Graham also has helpful suggestions on how to deepen your time with God including the value of personalizing scripture and an ABC list of God's attributes for use in prayer. In every chapter she looks to Scripture and the encounters we find there shows us how to apply them to our situations.

Graham deals honestly with fear, uncertainty, and the questions each of us has had in the past or will experience in the future. She leaves us with this thought: "In the midst of our impossible circumstances, God extends His hope to us. The hope of a future. The hope of restoration....no matter how hopeless it may seem, no matter how grim the prospects, God can transform it for good," (Graham 2009, p. 224).




